Monuments of Malaga

Malaga is a beautiful city located in the south of Spain, on the Mediterranean Sea. It is one of the oldest cities in Europe – over 2800 years old! Thanks to this, you can see many interesting monuments here that tell about the rich history of this place.

One of the most important monuments of Malaga is the Alcazaba – a powerful Arab fortress from the 11th century. From its walls, there is a view over the entire city and the port. Right next to the Alcazaba are the ruins of a Roman theatre, which were discovered only in the 20th century. This is proof that cultures and influences of different nations mixed in Malaga.

On the hill above the city stands the Gibralfaro Castle, also from Arab times. It was once a place of defense, and today you can admire an amazing panorama of Malaga and the Costa del Sol coastline from there.

In the very center of the city, there is also a cathedral, called by the locals "La Manquita," or "The One-Armed Lady," because the construction of one of the towers was never completed. Inside, you can see beautiful altars, sculptures, and paintings.
